Employment Outlook for Emergency Medical Technicians

- ◆ Projected to grow much faster than average over the next decade
- ◆ Our population is aging and will experience more medical emergencies
- ◆ Job availability ranges from medical and surgical hospitals, local government agencies, and ambulatory health care services
- ◆ EMTs are typically dispatched by a 911 operator, and often work with police and fire department personnel
- ◆ EMTs provide vital services in emergencies such as automobile accidents, drowning, childbirth and gunshot wounds

Pre-requisites:

- ◆ High School Diploma or (GED)
- ◆ Demonstration of a minimum of 9th grade proficiency in reading, language, and math
- ◆ Pass a physical and TB test
- ◆ Provide negative TB test
- ◆ Be physically capable of lifting heavy equipment

Students must provide a negative TB test or chest X-ray in order to register for the class (see your personal physician or choose provider from the list available in the office).
